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Siena College Poll:

Paterson Trails Cuomo, Giuliani & Lazio Heading into 2010

Giuliani, Pataki Strongest Reps; Cuomo, Schumer Strongest Dems Comptroller, AG (without Cuomo), Junior Senator Closest Races 1 Year Out

Loudonville, NY. Less than one year before the 2010 elections and less than 10 months before the currently scheduled primary date, Governor David Paterson trails Attorney General Andrew Cuomo by nearly 60 points in a potential Democratic primary, trails former New York City Mayor Rudy Giuliani by more than 20 points, and for the first time trails former Congressman Rick Lazio by three points, according to a new Siena (College) Research Institute poll of registered voters. Of 26 potential candidates for statewide office next year that Siena tested – Republicans and Democrats, incumbents and challengers – only Cuomo and Senator Charles Schumer on the Democratic side and Giuliani and former Governor George Pataki on the Republican side have favorability ratings over 50 percent.

"While the Governor's favorability rating saw slight improvement, no other measure of his electability increased noticeably. In a Democratic primary against Cuomo, Paterson fell even further behind, 75-16 percent, and in a general election matchup against Lazio, Paterson trails for the first time ever, albeit closely 42-39 percent. In the Democratic primary, Cuomo now has a two-to-one lead over Paterson among African American voters," said Siena pollster Steven Greenberg. "While it's true that the Governor's new commercials had only been airing for less than a week while Siena was polling, it seems clear that he's going to have to spend a lot of campaign funds very early to even have a chance of improving the measurements by which voters judge David Paterson."

[&]quot;Cuomo extended his lead over Giuliani to 12 points and kept a 45-point lead over Lazio," Greenberg said.

Paterson's favorable/unfavorable rating is 33-56 percent (up from 27-61 percent last month). His job performance rating (21 percent positive, 79 percent negative) is virtually unchanged from last month.

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"Among the Democrats, only Cuomo (70 percent) and Schumer (60 percent) have favorability ratings as high as 35 percent. More than two-thirds of voters don't know enough about 11 potential Democratic candidates for statewide office next year, including State Comptroller Tom DiNapoli, who is only slightly more known than Nassau County District Attorney Kathleen Rice and viewed only slightly less favorably than Nassau County Executive Tom Suozzi," Greenberg said.

who have only two potential candidates, Giuliani (62 percent) and Pataki (55 percent), with favorability ratings higher than 30 percent," Greenberg said. "And if one or both of those well known and well liked Republicans don't run – and neither has committed to being a candidate next year – there are no Republicans who at this stage of the cycle are even remotely well known to voters statewide."

DiNapoli & Thompson Tied Among Democrats; Both Beat Faso but Currently DiNapoli is Stronger

"If New York City Comptroller Bill Thompson opts to challenge DiNapoli, they start tied at 31 percent each in a matchup among Democrats," Greenberg said. "DiNapoli would currently beat one-time comptroller and gubernatorial candidate John Faso 41-25 percent, while Thompson has a smaller 36-30 percent lead over Faso."

Gillibrand Way Ahead (but Under 50 percent) Against Unknown Democrat; Trails Giuliani; Ties Pataki "Senator Kirsten Gillibrand leads the virtually unknown Jonathan Tasini 47-13 percent, with nearly two in five Democrats not willing to commit," Greenberg said. "Against either Giuliani or Pataki, Gillibrand is looking at a very tough race. Giuliani has a narrow 49-43 percent lead, while Gillibrand has a 45-44 percent lead over Pataki.

Among 9 Candidates – but Not Cuomo – Nearly 60 Percent of Democrats Have No Preference Yet for AG "Although Attorney General Cuomo says he plans to run for re-election – and if he does, 68 percent are prepared to re-elect him – if he doesn't, there is no early favorite in a Democratic primary likely to feature a very large

field," Greenberg said. "Suozzi (11 percent) and Rice (10 percent) are the only two candidates with double digit support among nine tested. The current big winner is 'don't know,' the choice of 58 percent of Democrats."

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This SRI survey was conducted November 8-12, 2009 by telephone calls to 800 New York State registered voters. It has a margin of error of \pm 3.5 percentage points. Data was statistically adjusted by age and party to ensure representativeness. Sampling was conducted via random digit dialing weighted to reflect known population patterns. SRI is an independent, non-partisan research institute.
