Siena New York Poll:

Voters Keep Gov. Paterson's Ratings Near Record Lows

Giuliani Widens Lead Over Gov & Gillibrand; Closes Gap on Cuomo Legislature Blamed Most for Deficit & Held Most Responsible for Solving It

Loudonville, NY. Governor David Paterson's ratings with voters – favorable/unfavorable and job performance ratings, as well as hypothetical electoral contests – remain near record low levels, according to a new Siena (College) Research Institute poll of registered voters. Former New York City Mayor Rudy Giuliani's potential electoral match-ups all improved in the last month. Voters blame the Democrats who control both houses of the Legislature more than the Governor for the budget deficit, and they hold the Legislature more responsible for proposing ways to close the deficit. When asked about actions that could make them more likely to support the Governor next year, the advice voters provide conflicts with budget realities and the Governor's stated goals.

Paterson's favorable/unfavorable rating is 27-61 percent (29-59 percent last month). His job performance rating is 19 percent positive, 79 percent negative (18-80 percent last month). Only 15 percent are prepared to elect Paterson Governor, while 72 percent prefer 'someone else' (14-71 percent last month). In a Democratic primary, Paterson loses to Attorney General Andrew Cuomo 70-20 percent (66-20 percent last month). In general election match-ups, he loses to Giuliani 56-33 percent (52-35 percent last month) and beats former Congressman Rick Lazio 39-37 percent (39-35 percent last month).

"By every measure, voters continue to keep Governor Paterson in the electoral cellar, and by every measure, Paterson's numbers are within a handful of points or less of his all time record lows," said Siena New York pollster Steven Greenberg. "It is now nine consecutive months of a favorable rating below 40 percent and eight consecutive months of a job approval rating below 25 percent.

"Nearly three quarters of voters – including two-thirds of Democrats and 56 percent of African Americans – would prefer to elect 'someone else' next year. A potential Democratic primary is now less than a year away, and while a year is a political lifetime, the hill that the Governor must climb is incredibly steep," Greenberg said.

"While the Governor cannot control the economy, he does have a major say on the state's budget. More than half of voters say they would be less likely to vote for Paterson if he balances the state budget with significant cuts in health care and education, and 53 percent would be more likely to vote for him if the budget is balanced without tax increases," Greenberg said. "It's clear from the Governor's proposal that he

is seeking to do both of those things. While it is arguably good budget policy, voters say it is bad political policy to balance the budget with large education and health care cuts, as he proposed."

"Giuliani beats Paterson by 23 points – up from 17 points last month," Greenberg said. "He closed the deficit against Cuomo to seven points down from 13. Against Senator Kirsten Gillibrand, Giuliani leads 53-36 percent, up from an eight point lead last month. His 60 percent favorable rating is within three points of his record high."

More Blame for Budget Deficit Goes to Dems in Legislature than Governor

"While 13 percent of voters blame the Governor most for the state's budget deficit, 19 percent blame the Democrats who control the Senate, 14 percent blame the Democrats who control the Assembly and eight percent volunteered that it was both houses of the Legislature. Another 20 percent blamed the Legislature and the Governor," Greenberg said. "Clearly, there's blame for everyone involved.

"Nearly half of voters – 46 percent – say the Legislature is most responsible for proposing ways to close the deficit, compared to 32 percent who say it's the Governor's responsibility," Greenberg said. "Three quarters of voters do not believe the deficit will be closed without increased taxes, as the Governor proposed."

Cuomo Should Run for Governor & He Can Take His Time Deciding What to Run For

"By a 49-36 percent margin, voters say Cuomo should run for Governor rather than re-election for Attorney General. And 53 percent of voters say Cuomo can wait several months before announcing what he's running for, compared to 34 percent who say he should declare now what he's running for," Greenberg said

This SRI survey was conducted October 14-18, 2009 by telephone calls to 624 New York State registered voters. It has a margin of error of \pm 3.9 percentage points. Data was statistically adjusted by age, gender, party and geography to ensure representativeness. Sampling was conducted via random digit dialing weighted to reflect known population patterns.
