Siena New York Poll:

Voters: Governor is Well Intentioned, but Ineffective and His Handling of State's Fiscal Situation is Off the Mark

Voters Prefer Rudy Not Run for Governor or Senate in 2010 *Jobs, Reform, Taxes are Top Issues Voters See in Campaign for Gov.*

Loudonville, NY. Nearly three-quarters of New York voters say that Governor David Paterson is well intentioned but isn't getting the job done. More than six in ten voters say that he is not effectively addressing New York's problems and his handling of the state's fiscal situation is off the mark, according to a new Siena (College) Research Institute poll of registered voters. Approximately one-quarter of voters want to see former New York City Mayor Rudy Giuliani run for governor next year, a similar number want him to run for United States senator, but nearly half of voters prefer that Giuliani not run for either office in 2010.

"Voters say Governor Paterson is well intentioned but ineffective. They say he lacks leadership skills and is off the mark on handling the state's fiscal situation.

Voters say he's not too liberal but is not fighting for people like me," said Siena New York pollster Steven Greenberg. "While voters overwhelmingly don't believe that Paterson's blindness hinders his ability, they believe his actions – or lack of actions – as Governor define him as ineffective. Even Democrats, by a

significant margin, believe the Governor is well intentioned, ineffective, bad on fiscal issues and lacking leadership. This may explain why Paterson is again near record low favorability and job performance ratings."

Paterson's favorable/unfavorable rating is 29-59 percent (down from 32-55 percent last month). His job performance rating is 18 percent positive, 80 percent negative (down from 23-76 percent last month). Only 14 percent are prepared to elect Paterson Governor, while 71 percent prefer 'someone else' (down from 15-68 percent last month).

"While Paterson trails Giuliani significantly and barely beats Rick Lazio, Attorney General Andrew Cuomo has a solid lead over Giuliani and crushes Lazio by 46 points, including a five point lead among Republicans," Greenberg said. "Cuomo continues to enjoy a better than three-to-one lead over Paterson in a hypothetical Democratic primary, including double digit leads among African American and Latino Democrats."

"Nearly half of all voters prefer that Rudy Giuliani not run for Governor or Senator in 2010, but 41 percent of Republicans want Giuliani to run for Governor and another 35 percent want him to run for Senator. If he challenges New York's Junior Senator, Rudy Giuliani is far better known than Kirsten Gillibrand, and currently has 46-38 percent lead over her. Giuliani has the support of 78 percent of Republicans, while Gillibrand has 53 percent support among Democrats. Rudy has a 12 point lead among independent voters," Greenberg said.

Close Deficit with Spending Cuts, Not Taxes

"Nearly two-thirds of Republicans, more than half of independents and a plurality of Democrats want the Governor and Legislature to close the deficit with spending cuts, not tax increases," Greenberg said. "Cuts to local governments are the preference of all three parties. Business tax increases are the most popular tax for Democrats and Republicans."

This SRI survey was conducted September 13-17, 2009 by telephone calls to 792 New York State registered voters. It has a margin of error of \pm 3.5 percentage points. Data was statistically adjusted by age, gender, party and geography to ensure representativeness. Sampling was conducted via random digit dialing weighted to reflect known population patterns.
