## The New York Times Upshot / Siena College Illinois 12 Poll: Republican Incumbent Bost 44%; Democrat Kelly 43%

Voters Prefer Republicans to Control House 46-43%; Give President Trump 48-46% Job Approval Rating

## Favorability Ratings: Kelly, 31-14 Percent; Bost, 40-30 Percent

Loudonville, NY. Incumbent Republican Representative Mike Bost and Democratic challenger, St. Clair State Attorney Brendan Kelly, are nearly tied with Bost up 44-43 percent, according to a new New York Times Upshot/Siena College poll of likely Illinois 12<sup>th</sup> Congressional District voters. Kelly has a 31-14 percent favorability rating, compared to a 40-30 percent favorability rating for Bost.

Likely voters in this southern Illinois district prefer Republicans rather than Democrats control the House of Representatives next year by 46-43 percent. Voters lean towards giving President Trump a positive job approval rating with 48 percent approving the job he is doing and 46 percent disapproving.

This New York Times Upshot/Siena College Poll is part of an ongoing project polling pivotal Congressional races across the country. The data is published live on <a href="https://www.nytimes.com/section/upshot">https://www.nytimes.com/section/upshot</a>. This press release highlights the key findings and provides access in the <a href="cross-tabulations">cross-tabulations</a> to the entire survey as well as how demographic groups answered each question.

This New York Times Upshot/Siena College IL 12 survey was conducted September 4-6, 2018 by telephone calls in English to 533 IL 12 voters. This poll has a margin of error of  $\pm$  4.6 percentage points. Calls were made to a stratified weighted sample of voters from the L-2 Voter list via both land and cell phones. A likely-to-vote probability was computed for each respondent based on their stated likelihood to vote as well as by virtue of the imputation of a turnout probability score based on past voting behavior. This combined probability to vote score was applied as a weight along with a weight that considered party, age, race/ethnicity, education, region within the district and gender.
