

AAPOR's Transparency Initiative is designed to promote methodological disclosure by acknowledging those organizations that pledge to practice transparency in their reporting of survey-based research findings.

Your organization can take the transparency pledge by disclosing 12 important details of your methodology:

Time: dates of data collection

Recruitment: methods used to recruit the panel or participants

Analytics: definition of the population under study and its geographic location

Name: who provided the sample

Selection: description of the sample design

Population: description of sampling frame and its coverage of target population

Administer: method and mode used to administer the survey and the language(s) offered

Researchers: who paid for the research study and who conducted it

Exact: wording and presentation of questions and response options

N: sample sizes and a discussion of the precision of the findings

Calculation: a description of weights and sources of weighting parameters
