This study was conducted April 14 - 17, 2023, among 854 New York State residents as part of a Community-Based Research course at Siena College with support from the Siena College Research Institute. Of the 854 respondents, 854 respondents were drawn from a proprietary online panel (Lucid). Data from collection modes was statistically adjusted by age, party by region, race/ethnicity, region, and gender to ensure representativeness. It has an overall margin of error of +/- 3.8 percentage points including the design effects resulting from weighting.
