This Siena University Poll was conducted August 3 - 6, 2026, among 811 New York Likely Voters. Of the 811 respondents, 523 were contacted through a dual frame (landline and cell phone) mode (288 completed via text to web). Telephone calls were conducted in English and respondent sampling was initiated by asking for the voter listed on the voter file by name. Telephone sampling was conducted via a stratified dual frame probability sample of landline and cell phone telephone numbers weighted to reflect known population patterns. The landline telephone sample and the cell phone sample was obtained from L2 Voter Database. Coding of open-ended responses was done by a single human coder.

Data from collection modes were weighted to balance sample demographics to match estimates for New York's population using data from the state voter file, on age, region, race/ethnicity, education, party identification, a combined measure of stated and derived vote likelihood, and gender to ensure representativeness. For the sample that answered the entire survey (n=691), it has an overall margin of error of +/- 4.6 percentage points including the design effects resulting from weighting. For the sample that answered the core questions (n=811), it has an overall margin of error of +/- 4.2 percentage points including the design effects resulting from weighting. Sampling error is only one of many potential sources of error and there may be other unmeasured error in this or any other public opinion poll.

5B. Sampling Specification	This is a Registration Based Sample. Only registered voters in the state voter file are in the universe. The telephone sample was acquired from the L2 database of registered voters.

10. Data Processing and Quality	Random quality assurance monitoring is conducted to review telephone interviews. Data are only discarded in the event that interviewers fail key quality benchmarks.
11. Statement of Limitations	Sampling error is only one of many potential sources of error and there may be other unmeasured error in this or any other public opinion poll. Real-world error includes sources of error beyond sampling error, such as nonresponse bias, coverage error, late shifts among undecided voters and error in estimating the composition of the electorate.
